1c) How will a parent learn about my child's progress in school or with a class?	Classical Charter Schools of Wilmington shares progress of students through a variety of ways. Progress reports (every 4.5 weeks) and report cards (every 9 weeks) are sent to parents in order to communicate student academic strengths and any areas for improvement. Feedback on conduct is also included. Weekly assessments, quarterly benchmarks, and end-of-grade testing are additional tools to measure student progress. All testing results are shared with students and parents as soon as results are available. 1d) What are the qualifications of my child's teachers?	Parents may look up your child's teacher licensure status at the NCDPI Licensure Website. The NCDPI Licensure Verification webpage does not include current employment information. Parents may need additional information (i.e., middle name or license number) to identify the teacher accurately. Substitute teachers (either short or long term) may not hold an NC teaching license. Please contact our Human Resources office to verify an educator's licensure status.
1e) What are the requirements for school enrollment? What are the immunizations needed or recommended for children?	At Classical Charter Schools of Leland, the application of any eligible student who agrees to be bound by the school pledge and adhere to the school's policies will be accepted and that student will be admitted if there is space available at the student level. If the number of applications received during this period exceeds the available number of openings, then all the applications will be placed in a lottery and assigned placement numbers as each number is drawn. 2a) How can a parent help their child learn and make progress?	Parent Involvement (excerpt from Homework and Grading Manual): Parents should provide adequate time and a proper environment for homework assignments to be completed. We encourage parents to be available to provide strategic assistance but discourage parents from providing work or answers to students, as this limits student improvement opportunity and is not in compliance with the School Pledge. Strategic assistance, however, aims to remove barriers to student learning, such as clarifying assignment questions when needed, or to direct students to the correct next step. It is important that students arrive at solutions by themselves, to allow them to reach their full potential. 2b) How can a parent help their child develop citizenship, social skills and respect for others?	Virtue is an essential aspect of our exceptional curriculum. 2d) Parental actions that can. place strong emphasis on the communication between the school and the home.	Classical Charter Schools of Wilmington understand the value of efficient parent-teacher communication. As such, our school and dedicated teachers regularly communicate through classroom newsletters and various digital formats to the current parent/guardian email address and phone number(s) on file. Written notice of any significant behavioral events is sent on the day of their occurrence. These formats are respectfully discouraged as a measure to ensure efficient communication by allowing teachers to manage only three points of contact (email, phone, written note) instead of several miscellaneous formats. Parents can view students' grades on the PowerSchool parent portal. The school will send home login information for the parent portal annually. This information can also be requested from the school office.
3) What programs are available for parents and their children?	Tutoring: Special tutoring is available to all students on an as-needed basis. Teachers are not allowed to tutor their own students for pay after hours. The use of an outside tutor during school hours is not authorized. Parents may elect to hire a tutor if they desire; however, they will not be allowed to use the school facilities. The use of any outside consultants, regardless of specialty field, must have permission from administration prior to coming on campus. Reading Camp: Reading camp is offered during the summer, fall, and spring breaks to students in grade

	1st-4th in need of remediation to ensure meeting the requirements of Read to Achieve (RtA). Student Mental & Physical Health: Since its founding, Classical Charter Schools of Wilmington has recognized that student mental and physical health are integral parts of a foundation for academic success. Charter Schools

Charter schools are public schools of choice that are authorized by the State Board of Education and operated by independent non-profit boards of directors. Charter schools have open enrollment and cannot discriminate in admissions, associate with any religion or religious group, or charge-tuition. Charter schools operate with freedom from many of the regulations that govern district schools but may adopt regulations of their own as authorized in their charter agreement. Charter schools are held accountable through the State assessment and accountability system.
